President & CEO Hathaway Strategies

Anne Hathaway is president and chief executive officer of Hathaway Strategies, an innovative grassroots public affairs firm headquartered in Indianapolis. Anne has extensive public service and political experience as a member of the George H.W. Bush White House, U.S. Treasury Department and the Republican National Committee.

In August 2023, Hathaway was tapped by Governor Eric Holcomb to serve as Chairwoman of the Indiana Republican State Committee and is the first female chair in the organization's history. Since 2018, Anne has also served as Indiana's National Committeewoman on the Republican National Committee. She served as chairman of the Committee on Arrangements for the 2024 Republican National Convention in Milwaukee and as co-chair of the Temporary Presidential Debates Committee. She previously served as Chair of the 2024 and 2028 Republican National Convention Site Selection Committees.

Anne served at the White House as Assistant to the Vice President and Director of Scheduling and Public Liaison for Vice President Quayle, was Chief of Staff and Midwest Regional Political Director for the Republican National Committee, Program Director for the 2012 Republican National Convention, and was Executive Director of the Indiana House Republican Campaign Committee.

Anne currently serves as Executive Director of the Richard G. Lugar Excellence in Public Service Series, which has trained nearly 700 Hoosier women to engage in public service and politics. In addition, Anne chairs and serves on many local and national not for profit boards and is a soughtafter speaker, especially about the current state of political affairs and the leadership roles women can play in business and politics.

Anne also serves as the Executive Director of the Indiana Medical Device Manufacturers Council (IMDMC), an association of medical device manufacturers and associated companies established to promote the medical device industry.

For three years in a row, 2022-2024, Anne has been selected as one of the Indianapolis Business Journal's 250, a list of the state's most impactful and influential business and community leaders.

In 2019, Anne received the Career Achievement Award from the University of Illinois College of Agriculture. In 2015, Anne was named an Indianapolis Business Journal Woman of Influence. Other awards and honors include being named to POLITICO's Top 50 Politicos to Watch, 2013 Torchbearer Award Winner from the Indiana Commission for Women, the Lugar Series Nancy A. Maloley Public Service Award, the Iron Jawed Angel Award from the National Excellence in Public Service Series and in 2016, the National Association of Women Business Owners – Indianapolis Trailblazer Award.

She is also the President & Chief Operating Officer for Fox Motors. Fox Motors is a retail automotive and powersports group representing 43 locations and 49 brands. The locations stretch from Chicago to Grand Rapids to Marguette in the Upper Peninsula of Michigan. Diane started at DP Fox Ventures in 1993 as the firm's Vice President of Finance. She was promoted to Chief Financial Officer a few years later, to Chief Operating Officer in 2009 and Chief Strategy Officer in 2023. She has handled acquisitions of all Fox Motors dealerships in her role as CFO and COO starting with the very first one in 2000. Diane previously worked at Deloitte & Touche LLP from 1987-1993 as an Audit Manager and as a financial consultant to DP Fox.

Ms. Maher is a graduate of Ferris State University where she earned her Bachelor's Degree in Accountancy. She received her designation as a CPA in 1987. She is currently a member of the Michigan Association of Certified Public Accountants.

Diane has received various awards and recognitions over her career. The Women Presidents Organization named her one of the 50 Fastest Growing Women-Owned/Led Companies in 2023. She has been on the list of the Top 200 influential leaders in Grand Rapids 5 times and awarded designation as a Top 50 most influential female leader in West Michigan in 2020 and 2024. In addition, Diane has been nominated 3 times for the Grand Rapids Business Journal Newsmaker of the Year.

Ann McBrien

Former Vice President, CBD Global Healthcare of Procter and Gamble Founder, AM Marketing & Sales Concepts

After graduating from the University of Illinois with a B.S. in Finance, Ann began her career as an entry-level sales representative for one of the world's largest and most respected consumer goods companies, Procter & Gamble. She quickly moved through the ranks, and in 2000 she was named the first female Vice President in the history of the Procter & Gamble Sales organization. At the time she was the first woman in the 160-year history of P&G to be named an officer of the company in Sales. In her last role, Ann was Vice President of Global Health Care Sales, an \$8 billion dollar business.

Ann regularly acts as a mentor and career coach to other women and lives by the credo, "you can have it all, but you can't have it all at the same time." That pragmatic truth led her to take a step back at the height of her professional career, focusing all her energy on a daughter (Katie) about to enter middle school and son (Matt). It was a choice she would make a million times over.

Still, it didn't take long before she was back making things happen on the business front. She and a partner acquired a full lineup of personal grooming products for young men from Procter and Gamble. The brand was called OverTime, or OT for short, and, at the time, was little more than a white paper and concept boards. She and her partner arranged for manufacturing, developed packaging, and built a national sales and marketing plan. They debuted nationally with Target and sold over \$2 million in the first quarter.

Ann's alma mater, University of Illinois, recognized her with one of their highest honors, bringing her back to campus as an Illini Comeback Guest. It was a fitting gesture as Ann started Illini Comeback in 1979 and was also a founding member of the booster group Illini Pride and student organization Orange Crush.

Today, Ann is actively involved in the Hilton Head, South Carolina community. She is the Development Chair and a Trustee for The Children's Center (nonprofit early education and child care) as well as a Trustee for the Heritage Classic Foundation (HCF). The HCF puts on one of the most popular PGA tour events, The RBC Heritage Classic. The foundation exists to enrich the quality of life for South Carolina residents and, in partnership with the PGA, generates over \$3 million each year in charitable giving.

### The Women In Enterprise Endowed Scholarship Fund
